The Community Centre is safe, inclusive, and open to people needing homelessness and domestic violence crisis support. Our team provides meals, referrals and specialist support services to vulnerable, homeless, financially disadvantaged, and socially isolated members of our community.

Available Services

In addition to free meals, the Community Centre provides the following services:

- Assessment and referral for emergency accommodation to relevant agencies.
- No Interest Loans (NILS) for people on low incomes to purchase essential items.
- Coast Connections Day 3rd Wednesday of every month.
- Energy Accounts Payment Assistance (EAPA) to help people in hardship pay gas and/or electricity bills.
- Food hampers made up from donated items.
- Use of computers for Clients.
- Alcohol & Other Drug Counselling by appointment / referral.
- Mental Health Support by appointment / referral.
- Social Work Support by appointment / referral.

Who We Help

Coast Shelter helps anyone in our community needing homelessness and domestic & family violence support.

Coast Shelter has partnered with the Health on the Streets Mobile Health Service, which provides on-site health check-ups at our Community Centre, for people experiencing homelessness.

Other initiatives include partnerships with Centrelink, NSW Police, DCJ Housing and Services NSW, who provide onsite Community Connection sessions, to help people get on top of personal issues they are facing.

Coast Shelter Accommodation Services

Women and Children

Coast Shelter offers accommodation and support for single women and women with accompanying children. Our three crisis refuges provide supportive and caring accommodation where women can begin to rebuild their lives. We utilise a number of 'transitional properties' in partnership with community housing providers giving women the opportunity to gain a positive rental history before moving into their own tenancy. Staff will assist women to find suitable permanent accommodation and develop the necessary living skills to maintain their own accommodation.

Young People

Coast Shelter offers temporary accommodation for young people aged 16 - 24. Our five youth refuges provide young people with the support and guidance to get their lives back on track. All young people are assisted to develop the necessary personal attributes and living skills to sustain an independent living situation, as well as education and employment opportunities.

Men

Coast Shelter supports men to identify their needs and set goals to help them find permanent accommodation and achieve self- reliance. Staff collaborate with other local support services to obtain additional assistance they may require.
